Workshop on Mentoring Support for Child-Centered, Gender, and Shock Responsive GPDPs - IIT Jodhpur



A two-day workshop on "Mentoring Support to PIs for Preparing Child-Centered, Gender, and Shock Responsive GPDPs" was conducted by IIT Jodhpur, the Regional Coordinating Institute (RCI) under UBA, in association with UNICEF, on 15-16 December 2024. The Objective of the workshop was to strengthen the capacity of Participating Institutes (PIs) in assisting Gram Panchayats in formulating inclusive and responsive Gram Panchayat Development Plans (GPDPs).

As part of the workshop, two interactive sessions were conducted - one on social mobilization by Lopamudra Tripathi from UNICEF and another on public health by Dr. Alok Ranjan from IIT Jodhpur. The Event brought together 45 participants from various colleges across western Rajasthan, who actively engaged in discussions and capacity-building exercises. The event was enriched with the gracious presence of dignitaries including Shafqat Hussain from UNICEF, Dr. Vivek Vijay, Regional Coordinator UBA, and Nirmal Gehlot, Project Manager UBA.







Workshop on Voices of Leadership -Women Sarpanch Transforming Grassroots Governance - IIT Jodhpur

On November 9, 2024, IIT Jodhpur, under the UBA-RCI, in collaboration with UNICEF, organized a roundtable titled 'Voices of Leadership: Women Sarpanch Transforming Grassroot Governance.' The event provided a meaningful platform for women sarpanchs from western Rajasthan to share their experiences, discuss challenges, and explore actionable solutions for empowering women and strengthening grassroots governance. The program began with an introduction to UBA by Prof. Vivek Vijay (IITJ), followed by a keynote address from Ms. Hyun Hee Ban, Chief of Social Policy, UNICEF India Country Office, who emphasized the importance of inclusive leadership in fostering sustainable development. The session was anchored by Dr. Akanksha Chaudhary (IITJ), who facilitated an engaging and insightful discussion among the participants. The event was graced by the presence of several dynamic women sarpanchs who are making significant strides in their communities: Anushree Punia (Pardhan) from Keru(Jodhpur); Kusum Singh from Rarah(Bharatpur); Sonu Sihag Saharan from Bhadwanwala(Shri Ganganagar); Sushila Devi from Vijai Mukundpura(Jaipur); Rekha Rani from Natai(Baran); Shobha Bisnoi from Chirdhani, (Jodhpur); Pawan Kanwar from Kalauna (Jodhpur); Suman Chaudhary from Khichiyan-Jajiwal (Jodhpur). Their collective voices reflected the growing impact of women's leadership at the grassroots level, offering valuable insights into inclusive governance and community empowerment.











AIIS Team Visit to Model Gram Panchayat Nandia Kalan (PI IIT Jodhpur)

On 18th January 2025, a team of faculty members of the American Institute of Indian Studies (AIIS) visited Nandia Kalan, a model Gram Panchayat under UBA, IIT Jodhpur to explore rural development and sustainable practices. Led by UBA Project Manager Nirmal Gehlot, the visit began with a traditional Rajasthani welcome, symbolizing village pride.

Key highlights included visits to the Gaushala (livestock care and organic farming), home-based farming (Self-sustaining Kitchen Gardens), Navgrah Vatika (Environmental Conservation),

pond conservation (Traditional Water Management), and a maths lab in the school (Practical Learning).

Special guests included SDM Jewar Ram Choudhary and Sarpanch Jaswant Singh. Prof. Anand K Plappally from IIT Jodhpur emphasized UBA's role in rural progress. The visit was enriched with the presence of Amar Sawhney, from, AIIS; Bhikhpuri Goswami from Surya Foundation, Ganpat Lal, Babulal, and others, fostering meaningful dialogue and knowledge exchange while reinforcing the importance of collaborative efforts in advancing sustainable rural development.







Transforming Bajra Waste into Eco-Friendly Handicrafts for Sustainable Livelihoods (PI SBRM College)

Dr. Saroj Kumari Fagodia of SBRM Government College, Nagaur, led skill development workshops to transform Bajra agricultural waste into eco-friendly handicrafts. In collaboration with Eco-Art Kaushal Vikas Foundation, workshops in Roopnagar and Nagri villages trained artisans to create sustainable products like home decor, jewelry, and handmade paper. Volunteers Seema Choudhary, Urmila, and Divya Tak also contributed to the

initiative, actively supporting training sessions and community engagement. This initiative empowers rural communities, reduces migration, and promotes environmental conservation. With proposals for further expansion, it aligns with India's 'Make in India' mission, fostering self-reliance and boosting Rajasthan's handicraft sector in domestic and global markets.











Empowering BHAKARASANI Village Through Education (PI Aishwarya College, Jodhpur)

On 2nd October 2024, an educational activity was conducted in Bhakarasani village under the guidance of Dr. Apurva Sharma, PI Aishwarya College, to raise awareness on key social issues. School students created interactive charts and models to educate villagers on topics like health, hygiene, sanitation, and environmental

conservation. The initiative enhanced awareness, encouraged critical thinking, and fostered problemsolving skills among students. It also promoted community engagement and participation, developing leadership and teamwork abilities.

Revitalizing Dhingana: Water Conservation and Sustainable Development

Dhingana Gram Panchayat, established in 2020 under the Luni Panchayat Samiti, has made remarkable journey of development under the leadership of Sarpanch Beerbal Ram Vishnoi. With a vision to transform the village, the administration has focused on key areas such as education, water conservation, environmental sustainability, and infrastructure development.

A major achievement has been addressing the village's water crisis. Previously dependent on costly water tankers, Dhingana now enjoys a consistent potable water supply, thanks to a 5 crore pipeline project under the Jal Jeevan Mission. Traditional water sources, such as ancient ponds and wells, have been revived through the MGNREGA and CM Water Conservation Scheme 2.0, ensuring year-round water availability.

This developmental work started with the initiative by some faculty members of IIT Jodhpur and a youth team from Dhingana, demonstrating the power of community and institutional partnership.



Recently, Dhingana hosted a visit from a UNICEF team, led by Social Policy Chief Ms. Hyun Hee Ban, and experts from IIT Jodhpur, including Dr. Vivek Vijay (Regional Coordinator, UBA), Prof. Anand K Prof. Plappally, Akanksha Chaudhary, and Nirmal Gehlot, Manager of the UBA. The team praised the village's especially in child development and water conservation, calling it an exemplary model for other villages to follow.





Orientation Wokshop (DCI Madhav University, Sirohi)

An Orientation Workshop for Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA) was held on 23rd January 2025 at Madhav University, Sirohi, with participation from over 10 institutes. Turning Waste into Wealth: Char Production Initiative in Birani Village

In Birani Village, Jodhpur, a transformative project titled 'Char Production from Textile Waste and its Potential in Water Treatment' (RP-03525G) is being led by Principal Investigator Dr. Kirti Sankhala with student researchers Sahdev Choudhary and Sriram Chauhan. The initiative focuses on converting textile waste into char—a carbonrich, porous material that purifies water and air, improves soil health, sequesters carbon, and offers a sustainable alternative to activated carbon. Through community engagement sessions at traditional water structures like the Naadi, villagers were educated on microplastic pollution,

traditional water systems, and the art of char-making. Over 150 residents participated, and hands-on training was provided in pyrolysis furnace construction and maintenance, empowering the local community with practical skills and economic opportunities. Blending scientific innovation with indigenous knowledge, the project supports SDG 3 (Good Health and Well - being), SDG 6 (Clean Water and Sanitation), SDG 10 (Reduced Inequalities), and SDG 13 (Climate Action), SDG 15 (Life on land) offering a replicable model for rural sustainability and circular economy practices.
