Chidambaram, Chairman, Board of Governors, IIT Jodhpur has kindly accepted to preside over the 8th Convocation of IIT Jodhpur scheduled on 12 November 2022.
	The Chairman requested the Senate members to join the Convocation in- person. The Convocation will start from 05 PM on 12 <sup>th</sup> November, 2022.
	The Chairman apprised members that as per the mandate of the IIT Council, the Institute started the process of review for the Departments / Schools / Centers (established at least 5 years before) by the eminent external experts with domain knowledge.
	Accordingly, the Internal Review of the following Departments / Schools has been conducted by the Separate Review Committee comprising external domain experts:

	The Committee has completed the Institute Review during <b>28-31</b> <sup>st</sup> <b>October, 2022.</b> The Report of the Committee is awaited and will be placed before the Board of Governors in its next Meeting.
	The Chairman also briefed the Senate members that a total of 512 (including 10 Preparatory) students are admitted in UG programs during the current Academic Year 2022-23. Thus, the overall strength of the students has reached to <b>4065</b> as of now.

recommended to provide the Degree(s) through NAD. However, later it was found that the structure in the NAD is not flexible. Thus, the Senate recommended to go back to original plan of going back to confer the Degrees in physical mode.
