<b>32.1</b>	<b>WELCOME BY THE CHAIRMAN, BoG</b> The Chairman, Board of Governors, welcomed Prof. Richa Singh, Deptt. of CS&E, IIT Jodhpur for joining the meeting of Board of Governors for the first time as Senate Nominee. The Board also placed on record the contributions of Prof. Surajit Ghosh, Deptt. of Bioscience & Bioengineering, IIT Jodhpur as Member, Board of Governors, in the capacity of Senate Nominee as outgoing Member of BoG.  Then, the Chairman, BoG, welcomed all other Members and called the meeting in order.
<b>32.1.1</b>	<b>To Confirm the Minutes of the 31<sup>st</sup> Meeting of the Board of Governors held on 11<sup>th</sup> November, 2022 at Board Room, IIT Jodhpur</b> The Board of Governors, confirmed the Minutes of the 31 <sup>st</sup> Meeting of the Board of Governors, as circulated.
<b>32.1.2</b>	<b>Presentation by the two faculty members on their research work /accomplishments before the BoG.</b> As per the decision of the BoG taken in its 24 <sup>th</sup> Meeting held on 5.12.2020, the following two Faculty Members of the Institute made presentations before the BoG about their research work:  <b>1. Dr. Ravi K.R.</b> , Associate Professor & Head, Department of Metallurgical and Materials Engineering made a presentation and explained about the translational research being conducted by his research team in the areas of "Additive Manufacturing (AM)" and "Self-Cleaning Coating". He discussed how research team at IIT Jodhpur has developed the "Indigenous Metal Additive Manufacturing Machine." Additionally, he briefed about his current work on developing closed-loop control in metal AM machines to regulate the microstructure and mechanical properties of laser additive manufactured materials in real-time. The Chairman, BoG suggested exploring the methodology of utilizing the Metal

	<p>AM machine developed by IIT Jodhpur for research by the Defense and Department of Atomic Energy. Dr. Ravi further explained the coating technology developed for easy and self-cleaning of solar panels. He also elaborated on the Transparent Anti-fogging coating developed for Endoscope cameras in association with AIIMS Jodhpur.</p> <p>The BoG suggested making efforts to establish Startup company and commercialize the "Metal AM technology" and "Self-cleaning and Anti-fogging Coating Technology."</p> <p><b>2. Dr. Suril V Shah</b>, Associate Professor and Head, Department of Mechanical Engineering, presented his research on Space Robots, an essential component of future autonomous On-Orbit Services (OOSs) missions. Dr. Shah first presented research on reactionless manipulation, post-impact control, momentum-based dynamic identification, and predictive control under uncertainty for a multi-arm space robot towards the capture of space debris. He also presented works on reactionless visual servoing, servoing to tumbling objects, and probabilistic model-based visual servoing for autonomous proximity operations using a space robot. A unique earth-based prototype of a space robot was also developed for validating various algorithms. It was highlighted that these research activities led to active collaboration with the ISRO Inertial Systems Unit (IISU) on dynamics, identification, motion planning and visual servoing of half humanoid for the Gaganyaan program and reactionless manipulation of space robots in the form of two RESPOND projects. BoG Chair and members appreciated the presented research on space robotics and active engagement with ISRO. Further, it was suggested to have an MoU with IISU in the area of space robotics to strengthen ongoing collaboration.</p> <p>The Chairman, BoG, and Members appreciated the presentations made by both the Faculty Members.</p>

#### **28.2.5: Interim Report of the Task Force for New Financial Model**

The Board noted and approved the following recommendations of the Finance Committee made in its 28<sup>th</sup> Meeting held on 13<sup>th</sup> March, 2023:

*"The Director presented the recommendations of the Task Force constituted for New Financial Model of the Institute before the Finance Committee. The purpose of the Financial Model has been designed to assist in actualization of the Vision of IIT Jodhpur. Therefore, to necessarily include measures for innovative resource mobilization for financing, operational expenses, growth capital, research expenses, and robust mechanism for financial planning, budgeting, MIS and accountability.*

*The Finance Committee noted various recommendations of Task Force and suggested minor changes as below:*

- 1. Objective: To rephrase the sentence as "Efficiency in expenditure, both revenue and capital" instead of "Adopting efficiency in expenditure, both revenue and capital".*
- 2. Suggested to change the recommendation regarding "Executive Education Champion". FC suggested that each academic unit should appoint a faculty as "Industry Interface Coordinator "to enhance engagement of the academic unit with the industry.*

*Considering the recommendation of the Task Force regarding the adoption of the PPP Mode, the Director submitted to the Finance Committee that the Institute may be allowed to establish the Guest House Construction in PPP Mode as the Ministry of Education is also encouraging the IITs to go for PPP Model and reduce its dependence on the HEFA Loans for such capital investments.*

*The Finance Committee welcomed the proposal of the Director and recommended it to the Board of Governors for its approval. The FC also suggested exploring the other possibilities / proposals in PPP Mode."*

#### **28.2.6: To consider the Investment Policy of the Institute**
