	The Director informed the Members about the sad demise of father of Dr. Hari Om Yadav, Registrar, IIT Jodhpur. The Chairman and Members expressed their heartfelt condolence to the bereaved family.

31.1.1	<p>To Confirm the Minutes of the 30th Meeting of the Board of Governors held on 14th September, 2022 at Board Room, IIT Jodhpur</p> <p>After detailed deliberations, the Board of Governors, confirmed the Minutes.</p>
31.1.2	<p>Presentation by the two faculty members on their research work /accomplishments before the BoG.</p> <p>As per the decision of the BoG taken in its 24th Meeting held on 5.12.2020, the following two Faculty Members of the Institute made presentations before the BoG about their research work:</p> <p>1. Dr. Sankalp Pratap, Associate Professor, School of Management & Entrepreneurship (SME), IIT Jodhpur presented his ongoing research workstreams before the BoG on the following:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. Incubation and Innovation Center Management as a new profession in the making; b. Support process / practices at Incubation Centers to improve the efficiency of public spending on Entrepreneurship Development; and c. Support and funding challenges for Deep Tech. Startups. <p>The Board of Governors suggested Dr. Sankalp also to explore the following:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. Identifying protocols that can protect the knowledge Worker's interests, particularly those working in Deep Tech. Startups, in relation to various private funding agencies; and b. Deriving insights from the experience of icons like, Mr. Steve Jobs with regard to founding and scaling Technology Start-ups. <p>2. Dr. Debanjan Guha Roy, Assistant Professor, Department of Civil & Infrastructure Engineering, IIT Jodhpur presented his ongoing Research work in the domains of Energy, Environment, and Infrastructure before the BoG. Dr. Guha presented his research work in the area of “Geological Engineering” with a focus on the following domains:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Geo-energy and Geo-resources (Rock Mechanics of Cryogenic Fracking) Dr. Guha briefed the BoG that the research integrates pore-scale modeling using molecular simulation, damage growth quantification using rock mechanical properties, and fracture propagation modeling using distinct element code to understand the efficiency of cryogenic fracking to produce hydrocarbon from unconventional low-permeability shale and from conventional reservoirs that have undergone long-term production. • Infrastructure (Sand Migration Mitigation Measures for the Solar Parks of Rajasthan) Dr. Guha also briefed the BoG that the large solar parks of India continue to be established on the uninhabited desert section of Thar Desert, Rajasthan. These parks are facing problems related to uncontrolled migration of dunes in their area of operations and erosion and removal of the sand cover. Therefore, we are currently focused on understanding how dunes migrate across various seasons and interact with large-scale critical infrastructures. We are exploring using path-based measures to deflect the sand-carrying wind or facilitate the early deposition of wind-borne sand. <p>The Chairman, BoG, and Members appreciated the presentations made by both the Faculty Members.</p>
31.2	<p>INSTITUTE REPORT BY THE DIRECTOR</p> <p>The Director presented the Institute Report before the BoG :</p> <p>At the outset, the Director briefed the Board of Governors (BoG) that the 8th Convocation of the Institute is scheduled for 12th November, 2022 and 516 Students will be conferred the Degrees / Certificates this year against the 402</p>

Students during the last Convocation of the Institute, as per the details given below:

Certificate of Specialization to graduating 66 B.Tech. Students will also be given during the Convocation.

It was also informed to the BoG that in this Convocation, the first Batch of MBA students enrolled in the School of Management & Entrepreneurship (SME), IITJ, and the Students of Masters in Medical Technologies under the joint Inter-disciplinary programs offered by the IIT Jodhpur and AIIMS Jodhpur, will also be conferred the Degrees for the first time.

The BoG was apprised that the number of Academic Programs at IIT Jodhpur reached to **78** from Academic Year 2022-23 and the overall Student strength of **4065**, Faculty strength of **231 (including 07 offered positions)**, and Non-faculty strength of **120**.

The Fund Analysis was also presented before the Board of Governors such as: an analysis of Actual Expenditure 2021-22, Revised Estimates for FY 2022-23 against the Budget sanctioned by the Ministry of Education (MoE). The analysis of the per-student expenditure against the financial support extended by the MoE was also briefed to the BoG. The Director submitted that the financial support provided by the Ministry of Education is declining over the years and is not proportionate to the per-student expenditure per annum.

Status of HEFA Loans

The Director also briefed the Board of Governors on the Status of HEFA Loans as under:

1. The Institute signed the Agreement(s) with HEFA on 2nd November, 2022 for the Term Loan of Rs. 350.47 Crores for the construction of Phase-3A of the Permanent Campus of the Institute after approval of the Ministry of Education.
2. The Ministry of Education has granted its in-principle approval for availing of a Term Loan of Rs. 75.00 Crores for equipment(s).

Subsequently, the status of new Research & Development Projects was also presented before the Board of Governors that the Institute has received **51** new R&D Projects (**34** Sponsored and **17** Consultancy) and **₹ 12.72 Cr.** grant till November 2022 in the current FY, which will get scaled up during the ongoing FY.

Details of the Latest Building(s) completed at IIT Jodhpur

The Director apprised the BoG about the status of the construction of 01 Block (G+3) Students Hostel Building (Y4) and 03 Block (G+3) Transit Accommodations Buildings with Pre-Cast RCC Technology funded by the IRG of IIT Jodhpur. The Director briefed that Y4 Hostel Building has been handed over to IIT Jodhpur and the work of Transit Accommodation is in the advanced stage of completion.

DRDO Industry-Academia- Centre of Excellence (DIA-COE) at IIT Jodhpur

The Director briefed the BoG that the Department of Defence Research & Development, Ministry of Defence, Govt. of India vide letter No. DFTM/05 / 3428 / M/01 / DIA-COE / 1012(i) /D (R&D) dated 30.09.2022 conveyed its sanction for the establishment of DRDO Industry-Academia- Centre of Excellence (DIA-COE) at IIT Jodhpur. An MoU has been signed between DRDO and IIT Jodhpur for the establishment of CoE.

The Director also informed that the Centre will be funded by the DRDO and will

Youth conclave is an annual event promoted by INAE. The purpose of the event is to provide a platform for the country's youth to express their technological creativity and ingenuity and demonstrate their ability to innovate toward finding solutions that impact our collective future. In addition, participating in this event provides an excellent platform for students to interact with fellows of INAE and experts who have distinguished themselves with significant contributions in Engineering R&D, Industry and Academia. The theme of this fifth edition of Youth Conclave-2022 was: "Emerging Technologies for Sustainable Future"</p> <p>UDBHAAS - JAL AUR JEEVAN during 24th to 26th September 2022</p> <p>The Director further briefed the BoG that Jodhpur City Knowledge and Innovation Foundation (JCKIF) and Indian Institute of Technology Jodhpur (IITJ) have jointly organized UDBHAAS to provide a platform for ongoing projects of Technology Intervention for Sustainable Water Source and Digital Craft for Livelihood from 24th to 26th September 2022 at IIT Jodhpur Campus.</p> <p>Objectives of the Event</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. To explore opportunities in Digital Craft that could be leveraged to provide livelihood to local artisans and promote Handicrafts and Handlooms; and 2. To showcase interventions in the area of water technologies, that are of utmost importance to the water scarce State of Rajasthan, and which directly impacts the livelihood prospects as well as quality of life of the people. <p>Key highlights of the event</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The BoG approved the recommendations of the 27th Meeting of the Finance Committee. The Members requested the Chairman to kindly bring this important issue to the notice of the Govt. of India for a solution to the matter. The Director briefed the proposal to the Board of Governors and apprised the BoG that the Institute has identified an Industry partner(s) namely, Rishabh Instruments Ltd. and Ivaan Foundation for Setting up of a Centre for Clean Energy. The Board of Governors was apprised that the recommendations of the 28th meeting of the Building & Works Committee held on 31st October, 2022 were placed before the Finance Committee in its 27th meeting held on 11th November, 2022.

On the recommendations of the Finance Committee, the Board of Governors approved the recommendations of the B&WC and accorded AA&ES as per below:

B&WC Agenda No.28.2.1: Phase 3A Development of Permanent Campus of IIT Jodhpur

The Finance Committee noted that B&WC recommended the Revised Administrative Approval and Expenditure Sanction (AA&ES) of Rs.3,74,02,91,152/- to the Finance Committee considering the impact of higher GST which increased to 18% as against the 12% earlier.

The FC also noted the recommendation of the B&WC that the construction work of the Dining Hall of Rs.24,42,35,542/- will be executed subject to the sourcing of funds by the Institute.

On the recommendations of the B&WC, the Finance Committee recommended the Revised Administrative Approval and Expenditure Sanction (AA&ES) of Rs.3,74,02,91,152/- as per the works break-up given in the B&WC Minutes, to the Board of Governors for approval.

As per the above recommendation of the Finance Committee, the BoG accorded Revised Administrative Approval and Expenditure Sanction (AA&ES) of Rs.3,74,02,91,152/- as per the works break-up.

B&WC Agenda No.28.2.3: Construction of New Building for Faculty Offices

The Finance Committee noted the following recommendations of the Building & Works Committee (B&WC) made in its 28th Meeting held on 31st October, 2022 on the proposal for the construction of New Building for Faculty Offices:

"The B&WC discussed the proposal and considering the need of the Institute, suggested to proceed with the normal load bearing structure for the construction of

new building for faculty offices. The CPWD apprised the B&WC that the cost of load bearing structure shall be approximately of Rs. 12.00 Crores instead of Rs. 13.50 Crores with total area of 2300 m². The B&WC scrutinized the Building Plan and suggested some change(s) such as: 2 Meeting Rooms in place of 4 Meeting Rooms on each floor. Accordingly, the B&WC recommended to expand the faculty offices along with Lounge Area on each floor.

After detailed discussion, the B&WC recommended Administrative Approval and Expenditure Sanction (AA&ES) amounting of Rs. 12.00 Crores for the Construction of New Building for Faculty Offices through Institute funds / resources of the Institute."
